

## In English Subject


This is a process of measuring student's achievement by unit test, the teacher comes to know about knowledge, skill, aptitude of student. A test may administered verbally, on paper, on a computer.

### Meaning Of Unit test

Unit test are conducted in the school to evaluate the summative assessment of teaching - learning process. By Unit test, the teacher comes to know about the effectiveness of his/her teaching process. The main aim of unit test is to isolate each unit of the system to identify, analyze and fix the defect.

### YEAR PLAN



## TEST


- Total silence is Compulsory while reading in the library the students disturbing the library environment will be fined Rs 50/-.

A variety of equipments made of glass, used for scientific experiments and other work in Science, especially in chemistry and


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Biology, Laboratories is known as Laboratory glassware.

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
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Laboratories are very important in school as students perform the various experiments and this brings interests in their learning.


The medium of instruction is Marathi , but they also have Semi-english . Marathi is the primary medium with english as Secondary medium.
